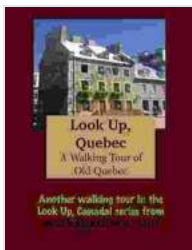

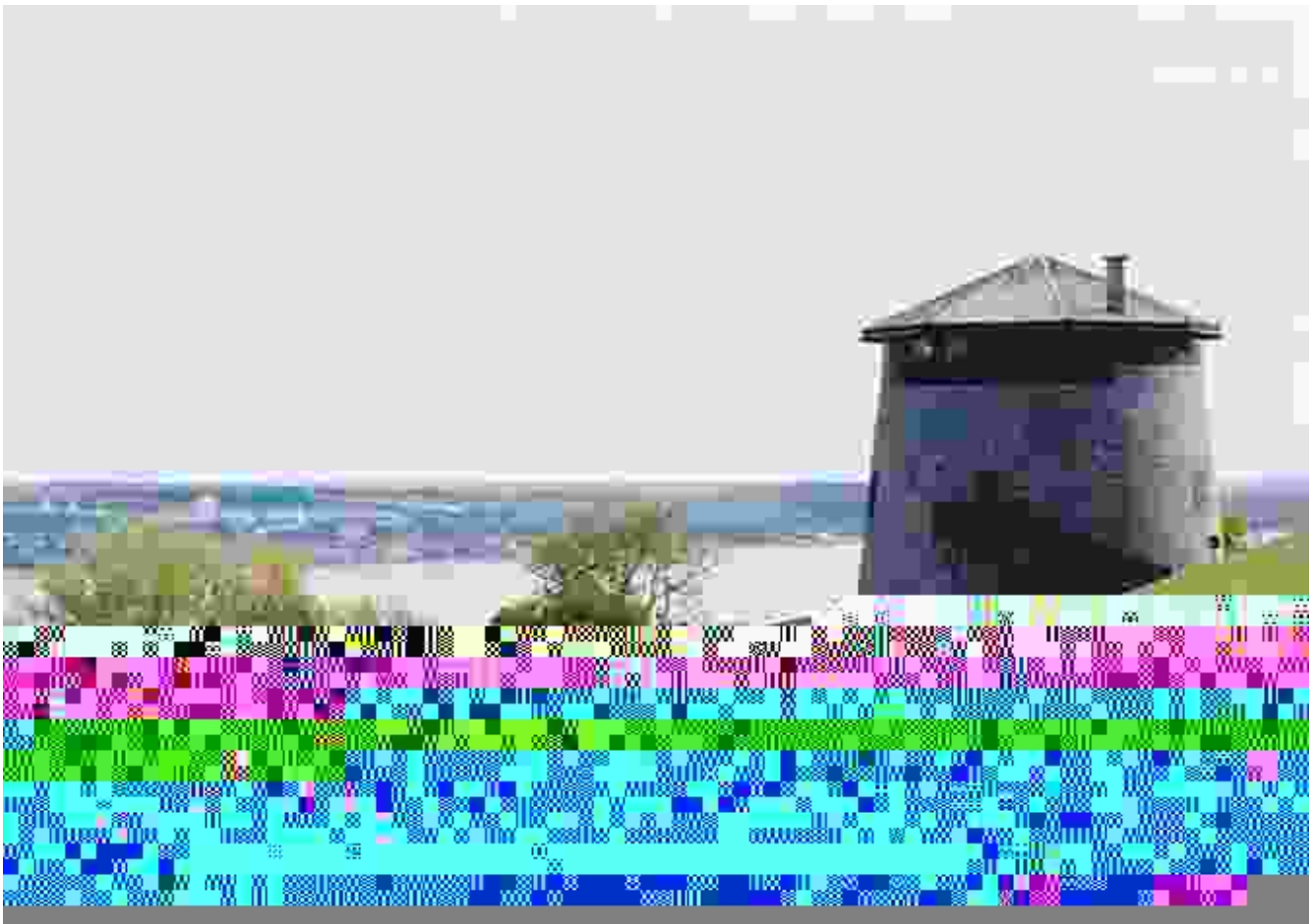

The Plains of Abraham: A Field of History



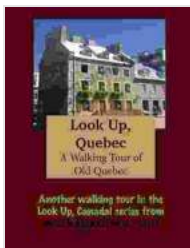
The sprawling Plains of Abraham

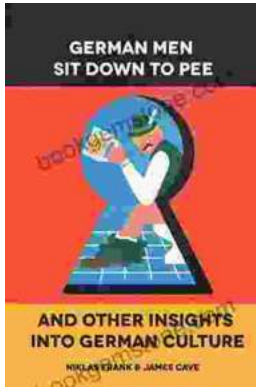
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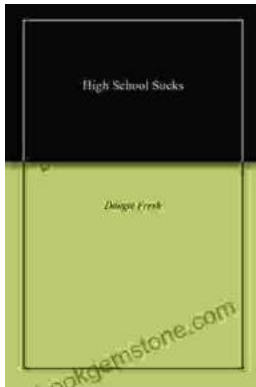
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
