Moving to Israel is not without its challenges. Here are a few of the things that I've found most difficult:

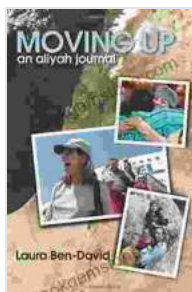

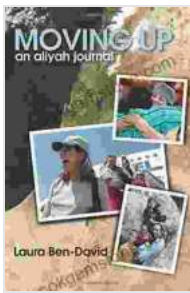
